Ron worked as a diesel mechanic at International Harvester, which was later sold to Nelson International, in Fargo, ND, for 19 years. He was then employed at Galvanized Inc., in West Fargo, as a shipping and receiving clerk for 18 years.

Ron was a member of First Lutheran Church, Veterans of Foreign Wars, the American Legion, and Disabled American Veterans.




