Who Needs to Be Notified?

At the time of death, it is the responsibility of the deceased's next of kin to notify certain organizations of the passing. Death certificates may or may not need to be provided to each, as they will all have differing policies. Photocopies may suffice in many situations.

The funeral director will collect the necessary information from you to file the death certificates. Death certificates are then certified and printed by the state vital records office and will be ordered by the funeral director on your behalf.

In general, the following usually need to be contacted by next of kin at the time of passing, and may or may not require a death certificate:

Social Security

The funeral home will provide the initial death notification to social security, but cannot settle any changes to benefits. Call social security at 800-772-1213 to begin this process. Social security will notify Medicare and Medicaid of the death.

Wills and Real Estate

Contact the attorney with whom the will was drafted. If no will is in place, it is still advisable to contact an attorney to begin the process of settling the estate.

Credit Reporting Agencies

Contact Transunion, Equifax, and Experian to minimize chances of identity theft.

Writing an Obituary

Here is a step by step guide on how we write an obituary. This can easily be used by anyone who wishes to write an obituary for the local newspaper.

In the first paragraph we include the following information:

- · Date of Death
- · Place of Death
- Surrounded by family, assisted by Hospice, etc.

In the second paragraph we include the following information:

- · Date of birth
- Birthplace
- · Parents' names
- · Education (grade school, high school)
- · Military service if applicable
- · Which war or conflict they served in
- · Where stationed if overseas
- Marriage/s
- · Residential history

Next paragraph:

- · Post High School Education
- · Degrees Earned
- · Licenses Held

Next paragraph:

Work history and work affiliations

Next paragraph:

- Church membership and organizations within the church
- · Civic Membership
- · Fraternal Memberships
- Club Memberships
 With all the above include any positions or offices the
 person may have held.

- Survivors, include spouse of survivor in parenthesis, and city and state of residence
